## Response to a request for official information



Thank you for your request for official information received 9 February 2021 by Nelson Marlborough Health (NMH)<sup>1</sup>, followed by clarification 11 February 2021 and 22 February 2021, a necessary extension of time 9 March 2021 and notice of decision 12 April 2021, where you seek the following information.

### PART A Women's health

1. Waiting times for urogyneacology

NMH response: Average wait time for Planned Care surgery in 2020 was 82 days.

2. Waiting times for colorectal surgery CLARIFICATION: ... surgery to repair colorectal tears incurred during birth.

NMH response: There is no wait time for repair of perineal tears that can occur during childbirth.

3. Waiting times for pelvic physiotherapy

<u>NMH response</u>: Referrals are reviewed by a senior Physiotherapist and the wait time can be up to four months.

4. Staffing levels for gynaecologists/urogynaecologists and physiotherapists

NMH response: Please see Table One for Full Time Equivalent (FTE) staffing.

5. Staffing levels for specialist pelvic physiotherapists.

<u>NMH response</u>: Physiotherapists work across a number of services, however it is estmated that 0.5 FTE is specific to Pelvic Health.

- 8. How many of these deaths were referred to the coroner? Figures for each year, for five years please.
