

Thank you for your request for official information as received 25 January 2022 by Nelson Marlborough Health (NMH)<sup>1</sup>, followed by the necessary extension of time 16 February 2022 and notice of decision 23 March 2022, where you seek information regarding referrals for Basel Cell Carcinoma (BCC), Squamous Cell Carcinoma (SCC) and Melanoma.

Please note, all skin lesion referrals are triaged by Nelson Bays Primary Health (for Nelson/Tasman) and Marlborough Primary Health (for Marlborough).

We refer you to the Primary Health Organisations (PHOs) for skin lesions removed in primary care by General Practitioners, or General Practitioners with Special Interest.

Our response below is for skin lesion referrals from primary care to secondary health care.

I am covering the issue of skin cancer care in New Zealand for TVNZ and would like to know the current size of the waiting list for all skin cancer referrals to your DHB as follows:

Initial consultation appointment for suspected or confirmed BCC, SCC and melanoma

NMH response: 39 (Non-Admitting – New cases) as at 17 March 2022

2. Surgical appointment for melanoma excision

NMH response: 9 (Admitting Wait-List cases) as at 17 March 2022

3. Surgical appointment for BCC or SCC excision

NMH response: 34 (Admitting Wait-List cases) as at 17 March 2022
